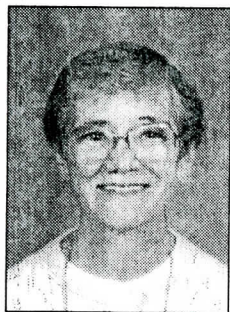


Genevieve Emmell
